XXIV. XXV. PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS, AND BE IT ENACTED, That nothing in this act contained shall Provise. authorise the faid directors to hold such lottery, or sell or dispose of any ticket or tickets for the same, unless the faid directors, or a majority of them shall first take an oath or affirmation, before some justice of the peace of the county of Worcester, that they will honestly demean themselves as managers and judges of the faid lottery, and that they will faithfully render unto the fortunate adventurers their respective prizes, and a certificate of such oath shall be returned, with the bond aforefaid, to the county clerk's office, under the feal of the justice who shall have administered the same.

XXVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid river, and the works erected thereon in virtue of River, &c. ef. this act, when completed, shall for ever thereafter be esteemed and taken to be navigable as a public teemed a highhighway, free for the transportation of all goods, commodities or produce whatfoever, upon payment of the tolls imposed by this act, and no other toll or tax whatever for the use of the water of the said river, and the works thereon erected, shall at any time hereafter be imposed by the said company, president and directors, unless with the consent of the legislature of this state; and provided always, that the same shall be subject to such further regulations by the legislature as they shall deem expedient, in order to prevent impolition by the faid president and directors, or to prevent fraud in evading the payment of tolls imposed on all articles or commodities carried up or down any part of the faid river or canal from Snow Hill to Mitchell's Bridge as aforefaid, or the division line aforefaid.

E IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That upon the death, resignation or disquali- How vacancies fication, of any of the commissioners of the town of Centre-Ville, appointed by the act to are to be filled. which this act is a supplement, or which hereafter may be appointed in consequence of this act, the vacancy shall be filled by the remaining commissioners, who shall immediately proceed to the election of a wife, discreet person, residing within the limits of the said town, whose office, as a commissioner, shall be vacated by his removal from the town.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners formerly appointed by the aforesaid act, within Commissioners one month after the present session, and every commissioner appointed in virtue of this act, before he &c. proceeds to act as such, shall make oath, or affirmation, as the case may be, before any justice of the peace for the county aforefaid, that he will diligently and faithfully, to the best of his judgment, perform the duties of a commissioner of the faid town, agreeably to the directions of this act, and the act to which this is a supplement, without favour, partiality or prejudice; and a certificate of fuch qualification shall be made and returned by fuch justice of the peace to faid commissioners, to be filed and recorded among their proceedings.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall meet annually at the court-house in And meet anthe faid town on the first Monday in April, and on the first Monday in every third month thereaster, and as much oftener as occasion may require, and when so assembled, the faid commissioners shall be and they are hereby authorised to cause to be removed all nuisances and obstructions that may interrupt the passage, or injure the health, of the faid inhabitants, or others, in the streets, lanes and alleys, of the faid town; to appoint and qualify a clerk, whose duty it shall be to keep fair and faithful minutes of their proceedings, in proper and well bound books to be provided by them for that purpole; to cause a just and fair affessment and valuation of all the real perty within the limits of the faid town to be made and returned, annually, between the first day of April and the first day of May, by the clerk to be appointed as aforefaid, and to impose and levy on the property so directed to be affessed and valued, such sum or sums of money, in just and fair proportions, according to the valuation aforefaid, as the commissioners shall deem necessary for the improvement of the said town, Hhhhh.2
