XXII.

XIV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid overfeer may compel and oblige any of the faid poor, And compel beggars, vagrants and vagabonds, or offenders, in his alms and work-house, if of a sufficient ability, to work and labour, and the produce of their labour he is hereby directed and empowered to fell, and apply the money arising from such sale to their maintenance and support.

MV. And BE IT ENACTED, That upon complaint made, that any person, from his or her disor- Disorderly perderly conduct, gives disturbance to his or their neighbourhood, and is likely to become chargeable to lons may be the faid county, it shall and may be lawful for any one magistrate of the said county, if upon hearing the party he shall judge the complaint to be well founded, to commit such disorderly person, refiding within the faid county, to the faid work-house, for any time not exceeding three months, unless he or she shall find security, at the discretion of the magistrate aforesaid, in any sum not exceeding thirty dollars, for his or her good behaviour during the space of fix months; and also upon complaint, and due proof made by the overleer of the faid alms and work-house, to any one trustee, that any vagrant, vagabond or beggar, in the work-house, hath behaved and demeaned him or herself in a disorderly manner, or hath refused or neglected to do and persorm his or her daily labour or task, or hath refused or neglected to obey, keep and observe, any of the ordinances, rules and by-laws, of the said corporation, to order and direct such moderate and proper correction, not exceeding lifteen lastes for any one offence, to be given to such offender, as the nature of the case may require.

XVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful to and for any of the faid trustees to Trustees to didirect and appoint, under their hand in writing, what poor shall be received into the alms and workhouse of fad county; and it shall and may be lawful for any one justice of the peace for the said ceived, &c. county, and for any person authorised and appointed by such justice, to apprehend, or cause to be apprehended and committed to the faid work-house, any vagrants, vagabonds, beggars, and other idle, dissolute and disorderly persons, found loitering or residing in said county, who follow no labour, trade, occupation or business, and have no visible means of subsistence whereby to acquire an honest livelihood, there to be kept at hard labour for any time not exceeding three months; and the overseer of such alms and work-house shall be obliged to receive any poor appointed as aforesaid to be received, and any vagrant, vagabond, beggar, and other idle, diffolute and diforderly person, so as aforefaid committed.

XVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every person who shall be received into the said alms and Poor, &c. to work-house, and there receive relief, shall, upon the shoulder of the right sleeve of the uppermost wear a badge, garment of every such person, in an open and visible manner, wear the sollowing badge, to wit: The letters P. W. cut in red or blue cloth, as by the overfeer of the poor shall be directed and appointed; and if such poor person shall neglect or resule to wear such mark or badge as asoresaid, and in manner as aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for any one of the trustees of such county to punish every fuch offender for every fuch offence, either by ordering his or her usual allowance to be abridged, suspended or withdrawn, and kept to hard labour for any number of days not exceeding twenty, as to the faid trustee shall feem meet; and if any overfeer of the poor shall receive into his said alms and work-house, or shall support, any such person, not having and wearing such badge or mark as aforefaid, and be thereof convicted upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of thirty dollars.

MVIII. And BE IT ENACTED, That who foever shall presume, either to set up a booth, stall, or Penalty on other convenience for the felling of strong liquors, on the land purchased for the use of the said alms keeping booth, and work-house, or shall commit any kind of trespass thereon, or shall fell or dispose of any strong liquor, or other matter or thing whatfoever to, or purchase any matter or thing whatfoever from, any poor, or other person entertained in the faid alms and work-house, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay the fum of forty dollars.

XIX. And BE IT ENACTED, That all sheriffs, constables, and all other officers and ministers of Sheriffs, &c. to justice, shall be aiding and assisting to the said trustees for the poor in the said counties, and to all fuch officers as shall be employed by them, as by this act is directed, in the execution and performance of the faid fervice.

XX. And BE IT ENACTED, That if any person or persons shall, at any time or times, be sued or General issue profecuted for any matter or thing by him or them done and executed in pursuance and execution of Pleadable, &c.
