VI. AND, whereas frequent applications are made to the general allembly for acts authorifing the laying out of new roads in the counties aforefaid, where the proprietors of the land through which the faid roads prayed for and intended to pass are willing that the same should be granted a And whereas by vesting a power in the levy courts of the said counties to determine on the propriety of fuch applications no inconvenience can arise to the citizens thereof; therefore, Britz Enacred, That upon application, in writing, from all of the proprietors of the lands through which any public road is intended to pals, for the purpose of obtaining any such road, the levy courts of the counties aforesaid respectively, being satisfied that the granting the same will be of public convenience, shall have full power, and they are hereby authorised, to direct the surveyor of their county to lay out any such road, not exceeding twenty feet in breadth, and to make return thereof to the said levy court; and after the road finall be Turveyed and laid out agreeably to this act, the faid court shall direct the application of fuch road, and the return thereof, to be recorded by the clerk of the county court among the records thereof, and thereafter and thereupon fuch road shall be considered as a

public road, and shall be kept up as other public roads are in the said counties respectively. This act, fo far as it relates to Somerict county, is repealed by 1798 ch. 38, feet 28.

An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, as far as relates to Cæcil, Talbot and Kent counties. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 515.

Preamble.

THEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that in Kent and Talbot counties a sufficient number of hands cannot be hired for reasonable wages to repair the public roads in faid counties, by which means they remain in bad condition, and the supervisors subjected to a fine for neglect; for remedy whereof,

Supervilors may require flaves, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the supervisors in the said counties of Kent and Talbot (a) shall have full power and authority, whenever it may be necessary, except in time of harvell, to require of the owner or owners thereof, in their respective counties, as many male able bodied flaves, most convenient to the roads to be repaired, as may be necessary to work on the same, not exceeding one half of the said slaves belonging to any person on any one day, nor shall any person be compelled to render more service in any one year than his or her road taxes amount to...

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That for every flave fo required by the supervisor, and not furnished, furnishing, &c. the owner thereof shall forfeit and pay the sum of five shilling to be recovered by the supervisors in the faid counties respectively, as in case of small debts, and when received shall be accounted for on oath, and paid to the levy court of the respective counties annually, or to their order, to be applied to repairing the public roads in their county.

IV. And he it enacted, That in Cacil county leven justices of the peace, or any greater. number of faid justices, shall be and they are hereby empowered to act as a levy court, and a majority of fuch court shall decide in all cases arising under the act to which this is an additional supplement, and the supplements thereto.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in Cacil, Kent and Talbot counties, all that part of an act passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-five, * entitled; A supplement to an act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of affembly therein mentioned, which relates to opening, clearing, improving or keeping in repair, roads upon contract, be applicable and extend to. fuch roads as were laid out previous to the passing the faid act.

Damages to be valued, &c.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED; That in Cacil county where any fum of money shall be claimed for damages done to any person or persons by a new road going through his, her or their land, for by the freightening or widening of an old road, the levy court may appoint three persons, not related to luch claimant, nor interested in the claim, as commissioners, to value, on oath or affirmation, such damages; and any fum agreed on by any two of fuch commissioners, may be considered as the damages allowable, and paid accordingly, if the levy court, and the person or persons claiming damages, hall approve thereof; and if the person or persons claiming such damages shall not be softent with
