CHAP. LXIX Justice, in certain cafes, may

XXVII. AND BE IT ENACTED. That if any part of the faid road, bridges or canfeways, upon which tolls shall have been received, shall be and continue to be out of good and perfect order and repair for the space of five days, and information thereof shall be given to any justice of the peace issue a precept, of the neighbourhood, such justice shall issue a precept, to be directed to any sherist, commanding him to fummon three judicious freeholders, to meet, at a certain time in the faid precept to be mention. ed, at the place in the faid road, bridge or caufeway, of which complaint is made, notice of which meeting shall also be given to the keeper of the gate or turnpike nearest thereto; and the faid justice shall, at such time and place, by the oaths, or affirmations, of the faid freeholders, inquire whether the faid road, bridge or caufeway, or any part thereof, are in fuch good and perfect order and repair as aforefaid, and shall cause an inquisition to be made, under the hands of himself, and a majority of the faid freeholders; and if the faid road, bridge or cauleways, shall be found by the faid inquisition to be out of order and repair, according to the true intent and meaning of this act, he shall. certify and fend one copy of the faid inquilition to each of the keepers of the turnpike gates between which fuch defective place shall be, and from thenceforth the tolls hereby granted to be collected at fuch turnpikes or gates for passing the interval of road hetween them shall cease to be demanded. paid or collected, at fuch turnpikes or gates, until the faid defective part or parts of the faid road bridge or caufeway, shall be put into good and perfect order and repair as aforesaid; and if the same shall not be fo put into good and perfect order before the meeting of the next court of the county wherein the president of the company shall reside; the said justice shall certify and send a copy of the faid inquisition to the judges of said court, and the said court shall thereupon order capies at respondendum against the said president, to which the name of the attorney general, or his deputy shall be put, on which action the same proceedings shall be had as in other suits at law; and if it shall appear that the neglect charged in the said inquisition is well founded, the said court shall give judgment according to the nature and aggravation of the neglect, and shall proceed to fine the faid president and company in any sum not exceeding two hundred dollars.

Shares may be transferred, &c.

XXVIII. And he it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for every of the said proprietors. to transfer his or her share or shares, by such deed, and in such form, as the corporation by ordinance shall direct.

Administrator may hold, &c.

XXIX. And He IT ENACTED, That in case any person shall die intestate, holding any share or shares in the said corporation tunds, the administrator or administrators of such intestate, or the furvivor or furvivors of them, shall hold the same interest in the said funds, and be entitled to all the benefits thereof, as the faid intestate in his life shall have had or held therein, and shall be and are hereby authorised and empowered to transfer the same, or make sale thereof in his, her or their own name or names, and that the same be subject to the same disposition as other personal property of the faid intestate.

When perfected, notice to be given, &c.

XXX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That fo foon as the faid company shall have perfected the faid road for any distance from Baltimore-town towards the city of Washington, or from the city of Washington toward Baltimore-town, not less than ten miles, and so from time to time any other like distance progressively, they shall give notice thereof to the governor of this state, who shall thereupon appoint three skilful and judicious persons to view and examine the same, and report to him, in writing, whether the faid road is fo far executed in a masterly workman-like manner, according to the true intent and meaning of this act, and if their report shall be in the affirmative, then the governor shall, by licence under the seal of the state, permit and suffer the said company to erect and fix fuch and fo many gates and turnpikes across the faid road as will be necessary to collect the tolls and duties herein granted to the faid company.

Certain toll to belong to the proprietors, &c.

XXXI. And HE IT ENACTED, That the toll for any ferry or bridge over any navigable water which may be in the line of the faid road, when located and established, shall appertain and belong to the proprietor or proprietors thereof, so long as such ferry or bridge shall be by him, her or them, supported and kept in good order and repair; but if, upon the presentment of a grand jury, and verdict of a petit jury, any proprietor of any fuch ferry or bridge shall be convicted of fuffering the same to be impassable for neglect or repair for the space of five successive days, he, she or they, shall, for the first and second offences, be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, and for the third offence, in the differetion of the court, such ferry or bridge shall be valued by a jury of the county, to be summoned and sworn by the sheriff of such county, and upon the payment of fuch valuation shall become vested in the said corporation, for the purposes of this act.
