III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every person or persons who shall produce a certificate as afore- Persons to be faid to the justices of Baltimore county at the levy court, shall, for every old wolf's head, be allowed, &co. allowed forty dillars, and for every young wolf's head be allowed ten dollars, to be by the faid justices affected and levied in the county levy, together with the sheriff's commission for collecting the fame, and to be paid by the fheriff to fuch person or persons as shall be entitled to the same as aforesaid; any thing in any other law to the contrary notwithstanding.

IV. This act to continue for two years, and to the end of the next fellion of affembly which shall Duration. happen thereafter. Further continued by 1799, ch. 55, to 30th October, 1801, &c.

-C H A P. VII. An ACT to prevent the exportation of flour and falted provisions, not Jan 1798. merchantable, from the port of Chester. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 578.

WHEREAS the town of Cheffer, by feveral acts of congress, has been erected into a port of Preambles entry and delivery, and regulations are necessary to prevent the exportation of unmerchantable flour; therefore,

IL BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the chief justice and the affociate Justices to justices of Kent county, or the major part of them, shall meet at some convenient place in said port, meet, bec. between the first and last days of March next, and between the first and last days of March yearly and every year thereafter, during the continuance of this act, and then and there nominate and appoint a person of good repute, and skilled in the goodness and quality of flour, to be impector of flour within the port for the year enfuing.

HIL AND BE IT ENACTED, That every chief justice and affociate justice who finall vote for faid And take an officer, shall take the following oath, or affirmation if a quaker, before he shall proceed to the nomination and appointment of the faid officer, before some justice of the peace for the county aforesaid, or each before the other: "I, A. B. do Iwear, or affirm, that I will faithfully, honestly and impar-tially, nominate and appoint such person to be inspector of flour within the port of Chester as I "think in my judgment and conscience is fit and capable of executing the said office;" and in case of the death, refulal, or the neglect to act, of fuch officer to appointed, the faid chief justice and affociate justices, or a major part of them, shall, as soon as may be thereafter, meet together and appoint one other such person as aforesaid in the place of the person so dead, resuling or neglecting to act, for the relidue of the year; and if the laid chief justice and affociate justices shall neglect and omit to nominate and appoint the faid officer as aforefaid, then the governor and council may appoint fuch officer, who shall be qualified agreeably to the directions of this act, and have the like power and authority as if he had been nominated and appointed by the faid chief justice and associate justices.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED. That every inspector of flour who shall be nominated and appointed Inspector to as aforesaid, shall, before his executing any of the duties of said office, take the oath, or make the take an oath, affirmation if a quaker, before a justice of the peace of Kent county, which is prescribed to be taken and made by every inspector of flour in and by the fixteenth section of the act passed at November seffion, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, * entitled, An act to prevent the exportation of bread . Chapter 12. and flour, not merchantable, and for other purpoles, and also the oaths to government which are wescribed by the constitution; and the said inspector of the port of Chester shall have the same allowance for the inspection of flour as by the said act is appointed and provided.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all and fingular the sections, clauses, provisions and penalties, in Sections, &c. anywife relating to the inspection of flour and examination of casks, which are contained in the said extended, &c. act, entitled, An act to prevent the exportation of bread and flour not merchantable, and for other purpoles, be and they are hereby extended to the port of Chelter, and to the regulation of the inspection of flour within said port, in as full and ample a manner us if the same had been herein particularly specified and mentioned.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid chief justice and associate justices, or the major part of Justices to them, shall meet, at some convenient place within said town, between the first and last days of meet, &c. Qqqq2
