

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That on a written agreement being entered into by and between John Nepton and John Seigler, settlers, their heirs or legal representatives, and acknowledged before a justice of the peace for Allegany county, ascertaining the proper proprietor of the lot three thousand seven hundred and forty-six, which agreement being produced to the said register, he is hereby authorized and required to correct the return conformably to the said agreement, and instead of the number erased to insert number three thousand seven hundred and forty-eight, an unappropriated lot, as belonging to the person whose number is erroneously returned.

C H A P. XXXI.
On agreement, return to be corrected, &c.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the several and respective lots changed and appropriated in virtue of this act shall be held by the persons whose names are set opposite to them, or their legal representatives, in lieu of those originally noted, as fully and effectually as if they had been allotted and awarded by the commissioners aforesaid.

Lots changed to be held, &c.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners of the tax for Allegany county shall, before the next collection of the county assessment, charge and levy on the respective persons, or their legal representatives, a proportionate assessment on the lots directed by this act to be allotted to them, instead of those formerly returned.

C H A P. XXXII.

An ACT to authorise and empower the levy court of Montgomery county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the support of Jemima Thompson. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 613.

Passed 26th of Jan. 1798.

WHEREAS Jemima Thompson, of Montgomery county, by her petition to this general assembly hath set forth, that she is in her old age, and entirely deprived of the use of her limbs, by frequent attacks of the rheumatism, and has no other dependence whereby to subsist but on the benevolence and care of her affectionate daughter, who is very poor, and prays an act may pass to provide for her future maintenance out of the poor's house; and the facts stated in said petition appearing to be true, therefore,

Preamble.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of Montgomery county shall be and are hereby directed and empowered, at their levy court annually, so long as they shall see cause, to assess and levy on the assessable property of said county a sum of money, not exceeding forty dollars, for the support and maintenance of the said Jemima Thompson, and that the same be collected and paid annually by the collector of Montgomery county to such person as the levy court of said county shall or may direct.

C H A P. XXXIII.

An ACT to authorise and empower the levy court of Saint-Mary's county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the support of Bennett Thompson, son of Elizabeth Thompson. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 614.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of Elizabeth Thompson, that she is a widow with several small children, accompanied with the misfortune to have a son afflicted with fits, deprived of his intellects, and one of his arms entirely useless, and praying that a law may pass for the support and maintenance of her said son out of the poor's house; and the prayer of the said petitioner appearing reasonable, therefore,

Preamble.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of the levy court for Saint-Mary's county shall be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to assess and levy on said county annually the sum of thirty dollars, for the support and maintenance of Bennett Thompson, son of Elizabeth Thompson, and that the same be collected and paid to them by the collector or collectors of Saint-Mary's county, agreeably to the order of the levy court aforesaid.
