of bargain and fale, make over and convey unto John Carroll, John Aihton and Robert Molyneux, certain lands in faid deed mentioned, lying and being in Montgomery county: And whereas at the time of faid conveyance it was understood between the parties thereto, that the faid lands should furnish a site for the purpose of erecting a college, or seminary of learning, und the government and control of the Roman catholic clergy of this state: And whereas in pursuance of such intention the faid clergy have, from their funds, erected spacious buildings upon said ground, and organized a seminary of learning, highly beneficial to many of the citizens of this state: And whereas to render the fituation of the college more convenient and healthy to the students, the said John Threlkeld did, by a certain deed of bargain and sale, bearing date the fifteenth day of June, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, make over unto the faid John Carroll, John Ashton and Robert Molyneux, a certain other piece of ground adjoining that above mentioned: And whereas the faid John Carroll, John Ashton and Robert Molyneux, in order to give perpetuity to faid institution, have prayed this general affembly that they may be enabled to convey faid lands to the corporation of the Roman catholic clergymen, and their successors, as a body politic: And whereas the prayer of said petition appears reasonable,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the faid John Carroll, John Ashton J. Carroll may and Robert Molyneux, or the survivors of them, be authorised and empowered to execute a deed of execute a deed, gift, in the usual form, to the said corporation of the Roman catholic clergymen, and their succesfors, appointed under the act, (a) entitled, An act for securing certain estates and property for the support and uses of ministers of the Roman catholic religion; and that upon the execution of said deed, the faid corporation of the Roman catholic clergymen, and their fuccessors, shall be seized and possessed of faid ground, in as full and ample manner, and of the same estate, title and interest, in law and equity, as the faid John Carroll, John Ashton and Robert Molyneux, now hold the same; and the faid property, and the rents, iffues and profits thereof, shall, from thenceforth, be under the fole control and management of the faid body politic, and their successors, so as aforesaid appointed.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, by the authority aforesaid, That the corporation of the Roman catholic Corporation to - clergymen be authorised, in behalf of the college of George-town, to receive donations from perfons charitably disposed, sufficient for the maintenance and education of thirty scholars, provided the annual amount or product of fuch donations do not exceed, in any one year, the fum of four thousand dollars.

IV. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all donations so made shall be applied faithfully to the How to be appurpofes for which alone they are allowed to be received, and not to any other uses of the corporation of the Roman catholic clergymen; for the ascertainment of which, the corporation aforesaid, when thereunto required by the general affembly, shall exhibit an account of all donations received by them for the maintenance and education of scholars, and of the uses to which they are applied.
