point three skilful and judicious persons to view and examine the same, and report to him, in writing, whether the said road is so far executed in a masterly workman-like manner, according to the true intent and meaning of this act, and if their report shall be in the affirmative, then the governor shall, by licence under the seal of the state, permit and suffer the said company to erect and fix such and so many gates and turnpikes across the said road as will be necessary to collect the tolls and duties herein granted to the said company.

XXIX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said president and directors shall cause to be erected directories, at proper and convenient situations, to note to all conductors or drivers of carriages on the turnpike road aforesaid, that they shall at all times pass on the left of each other, under the penalty of three dollars for every offence, to be recovered and applied as aforesaid.

XXX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if the said company shall not proceed to carry on said work within two years after the passing this act, and shall not within twenty years afterwards complete the said road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then, in either of these cases, it shall and may be lawful for this state to reserve all and singular the rights, liberties and privileges, hereby granted to the company.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by virtue of an act, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to streighten and amend the several public roads in several counties, and for other purposes therein mentioned, passed at November session, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, \* a road has been laid out from the east end of Patrick-street, in Frederick-town, to cross Monocacy at Gomer's ferry, thence by William-Hobb's to meet the Anne-Arundel road leading from the Baltimore turnpike road towards Frederick-town: And whereas part of the said road lies in Baltimore county, and between the lines of Frederick and Anne-Arundel counties, and by the said act no power is given to the justices of Baltimore county to levy money for the purpose of keeping that part of the road in repair,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That such part of the aforesaid road as lies in Baltimore county be henceforth deemed and taken as a public highway, and that the same be hereafter kept up and repaired at the county charge in the same manner as other public roads in Baltimore county are.

C H A P. LXVIII.

An ACT to authorise the laying out a public road from John Neale's lane, in Harford county, to intersect the road leading to the city of Baltimore. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 673.

Preamble.

WHEREAS a public road leading from a place known by the name of John Neale's Lane, in Harford county, to intersect a great road leading to the city of Baltimore, will be a great public convenience, and is essentially necessary; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Harford county are hereby authorized and required, at their next levy court, to appoint five discreet, sensible and disinterested persons, as commissioners, to lay out a public road beginning at a place known by the name of John Neale's Lane, and to run in a direction so as to intersect a great road leading to the city of Baltimore, which passes by a place known by the name of Cox's Mill to the Upper Cross Roads; in the laying out of which public road the said commissioners are directed to take into view as well the disadvantages which may result to individuals over whose lands the said road may run, as the convenience of the public, so as to lay out the said road with as little injury to private property as will comport with the public convenience.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners are hereby further directed to return a plot of said road so by them laid out to the clerk's office of said county, to be there recorded, and the
