

1707. NOVEMBER. LAWS OF MARYLAND.

C H A P. CV. by law for payment of the county levies, the commissioners of review, or a majority of them, shall proceed against the said collector or collectors, and their securities, in the same manner as the justices of the peace are directed by the act for the establishment and regulation of the levy courts in the several counties in this state are directed to proceed against collectors, and their securities, and there shall be similar proceedings, and similar remedy, for the recovery of the same.

Proviso.

An ACT to pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 759.

WHEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities and labour, to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following officers of civil government for the time being shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries in current money for the ensuing year, to wit: The treasurer of the western shore, two thousand dollars; the treasurer of the eastern shore, four hundred and fifty dollars; the auditor, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the council, seven hundred dollars; the clerk of the senate, one hundred and fifty dollars; the clerk of the house of delegates, three hundred dollars; the printer of the state, fourteen hundred dollars; the messenger to the council, two hundred and fifty dollars.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all monies which shall remain in the treasury, after discharging the journal of accounts, and all monies heretofore appropriated to the use of congress, which shall hereafter be received, and all unappropriated money which may come into the treasury, be first applied to the payment of the civil list for the ensuing year.

C H A P. CVII.

An ACT to increase the fees of the examiner-general of the western shore, and the examiner of the eastern shore. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 759.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That immediately after the passing of this act, the fees of the examiner-general of the western shore shall be and they are hereby increased thirty-three and a third per cent. in addition to his fees already allowed by law.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That immediately after the passage of this act the fees of the examiner on the eastern shore shall be and they are hereby increased thirty-three and one third per cent. in addition to his fees already allowed by law.

III. This act to continue and be in force till the twentieth day of October, eighteen hundred, and till the end of the next session of assembly that shall happen thereafter.

C H A P. CVIII.

An ACT authorising Henry Stevenson, collector of Baltimore county, to complete his collections. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 760.

WHEREAS Henry Stevenson, late collector of Baltimore county, hath set forth by his petition to this general assembly, that there is still due to him as collector a considerable sum of money, which he has been unable to collect, and prays that a longer time may be allowed him to complete the collection of the same,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Henry Stevenson be and he is hereby authorised to collect all balances due him as collector for the last year, at any time before the first day of October next, in the same manner as he could or might have done whilst he was collector, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

III. PROVIDED ALWAYS, AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said Henry Stevenson, before he proceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons for officers fees or taxes, shall, at least ten days before such execution or distress, deliver to the person chargeable with the same an account, written in words at full length, of the taxes demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavit
