

C H A P. CXX.

An ACT for rebuilding a bridge over Jones's Falls, in Baltimore county. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 1.

Passed 21st of Jan. 1798.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Baltimore county shall levy and assess on the assessable property of said county, for rebuilding the bridge over Jones's Falls, in the city of Baltimore, commonly called the Lower Bridge, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars, with the usual commission to the sheriff for collection, to be collected with the county levy in the year seventeen hundred and ninety-eight; which sum of money, when levied and collected, shall be paid to the commissioners herein after named.

Money to be levied, &c.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That Richard Caton, John O'Donnell, and Richard Lawson, shall be and are hereby appointed commissioners to contract for rebuilding the said bridge; and in case any vacancy shall happen in the said appointment of commissioners before the said bridge shall be rebuilt, the remaining commissioners shall supply such vacancy.

C H A P. CXXI.

C H A P. CXXII.

An ACT for the payment of the journal of accounts. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 6.

WHEREAS it appears by the journal of accounts of this session, that there is now due from this state the sum of eleven thousand four hundred and twenty-nine pounds nineteen shillings and five-pence farthing,

Preamble.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore shall and he is hereby authorized and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of any money now in the treasury, or that shall come into the treasury, subject to the appropriation of the general assembly.
