faid county, and be thereafter deemed and taken to be a public road, and shall be kept in repair as other public roads in faid county are directed to be kept.

Freeholders to be fummoned,

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid shall and they are hereby directed to apply to any justice of the peace for the county aforefaid, who shall issue his warrant, under handand feal, directed to any constable of the faid county, commanding him to summon twelve freeholders, difinterested as to the lands, and not connected with any person through whose lands the said road may pass, to appear at a place and on a day by him to be appointed, and after taking the following oath, or affirmation, as the case may be, to wit: "I, A. B. do swear, or solemnly, sincerely and truly declare and affirm, that I will honeftly and faithfully estimate and value the damage and " injury sustained by C. D. by opening a road through the land of the said C. D. in pursuance of the " directions of this act," shall proceed to afcertain and value what damages may be fullained by any person or persons through whose land the said road may pass, by opening and clearing the same, and shallreturn the damages by them assessed to the clerk of the said county, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive; and after the valuation so made, the said commissioners shall proceed to open and clear the same, provided that the said road shall not pass through any houses, gardens, orchards or meadows, unless with the consent of the owner thereof.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the clerk of the faid county, at their next levy court following, fliall lay the damages to affelled before the faid court, and the justices of the faid court shall levy upon the affestable property of the faid county the damages to adjudged to be fustained by the persons through whose lands the road as aforesaid shall pass, and which sum, when collected, shall be paid to the person or persons sustaining such damages by the collector of the said county.

An ACT to authorise the building a market-house on the county wharf in Chester-town, in Kent county, and for the regulation of the said market. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 96.

Preamble.

THEREAS it has been represented to this general assembly, by the memorial of fundry inhabitants of Chester-town, in Kent county, that the market-house at present in the said town is too small for the accommodation of the inhabitants thereof, and is situated at such a distance from the water as to make it inconvenient to many persons to attend the same, and they have prayed for the liberty of erecling another market-house on the county wharf in the said town, at their own expence, and to establish the same as a market, when it shall be completely finished; and the same appearing reasonable to this general assembly, therefore,

Commissioners appointed, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED; by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Richard Tilghman, the fourth, William M'Kenny and Robert Anderson, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners for the purposes in this act mentioned; and the faid commissioners, or any two of them, are hereby authorifed to receive, by fubfcription or otherwife, such sum or sums of money as they may think necessary for the purpose of building a market-house on the public ground adjoining the county wharf in Chester-town, in Kent county, and the faid commissioners, or any two of them, be and they are hereby empowered, as foon as a sufficient sum of money shall be subscribed, and such part thereof collected as they may think necessary, to contract and agree with any person or persons they may think proper to creet and build a market-house on some part of the public ground adjoining the county wharf in Chester-town, in Kent county, to be fixed and agreed on by the said commissioners, or any two of them, sufficiently large for the accommodation of the inhabitants of the said town.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That as foon as the faid market-house shall be finished, all and singular extended, &c. the provisions mentioned in the act, * entitled, An act to establish a market at the market-house in Chester-town, in Kent county, and for the regulation of the faid market, and the different supplements passed thereto, shall be and the same are hereby extended to the market-house to be built and established by virtue of this act, so far as the same shall not be inconsistent with any of the provisions herein contained.

Market days.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That Tuesdays (a) and Fridays in every week shall be set apart, appointed and held, as market-days for faid market, as foon as the fame shall be completely finished.

(a) By chapter ot, Mondays are substituted for Tuesdays.

V. And
