C H A P. XLII. An ACT for the relief of Henry Clark, senior, of Montgomery county. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 98. Passed 15th of A Private Act.

An ACT to empower the levy court of Baltimore county to affels and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 99.

WHEREAS Henry Ridgely hath represented to this general assembly; that in the month of No-Preambles venture, seventeen hundred and ninety-fix, he was appointed chief justice of the third district of Maryland, as also chief justice of the criminal court of Baltimore county; and that the chief justice of the faid diffrict was, by the act of affembly in that cafe made and provided, entitled to receive a compensation for his fervices as chief justice of the said Baltimore county criminal court, at the rate of two hundred pounds current money per annum, only on the condition that the faid chief justice should actually reside in the city of Baltimore: And whereas the said Henry Ridgely hath stated, that owing to fundry accidents and inconveniencies he was rendered utterly unable to take up his residence in the city of Baltimore, as the law required, from the month of November, seventeen hundred and ninety-fix, to the month of November, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven, and that in consequence thereof he forfeited the payment of the falary appertaining to him as chief justice of the Baltimore county criminal court for that time, notwithstanding that he actually officiated as chief justice of the faid Baltimore county criminal court at very confiderable labour and expence, for which he has never been compensated; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the justices of the levy court of Justices to levy Baltimore county shall be and they are hereby directed and empowered to affels and levy on faid money, &c. county the fum of two hundred pounds current money, and that the fame, when collected by the collector of Baltimore county, fluil be by him paid, according to the order of the levy court aforefaid, to the faid Henry Ridgely, as a compensation for his services as chief justice of Baltimore county criminal court from the month of November, seventeen hundred and ninety-fix, to the month of November, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven.
