it has been rendered totally inadequate to the end of its institution, and that there are fundry out. CHAP. standing and unsatisfied claims existing against the said college, for the payment of which they, whe said trustees, are liable: And whereas the said trustees have prayed that an act may pass, empowering them to dispose of the effects belonging to said college for the purpose of satisfying the claims so as aforesaid existing against it, which appearing to be reasonable, therefore,

Truflees may fell, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the trustees of Cokesbury college, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell and dispose of all the property, real and personal, belonging to the said college, and to apply the money thence arising • 1794, ch. 26. to the payment of debts existing against said college, any thing in the act * for the incorporating faid college to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAP.

Passed 15th of Jan. 1799.

An ACT to empower the levy court of Harford county to Jess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned. Lib. IG. No. 3. fol. 126.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Mary Morrison, of Harford county, by her petition to this general assembly hath fet forth, that she hath a sister, who has for a considerable time been afflicted with lunacy, and prays that a law may pass to provide for her support out of the poor's house; therefore,

Justices to levy money, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of Harford county shall be and they are hereby directed and empowered, at their courts annually, as long as they, in their discretion, may think proper, to affess and levy on said county a sum of money, not exceeding forty dollars, for the support and maintenance of Elizabeth Morrison, the faid lunatic, and that the faid fum be collected and paid annually to the aforefaid Mary Morrison, or such other person as the said levy court may direct, by the collector or collectors of Harford county, for the purposes aforesaid, agreeable to the orders of the levy court of faid county.

C H A P. LXII.

An ACT to empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to affess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned.

Preamble.

THEREAS Mary Williams, of Anne-Arundel county, by her petition to this general affembly hath fet forth, that she is so far advanced in age as to be rendered incapable of supporting herself by labour; that the thought of being obliged to go to the poor-house, where she must necesfarily spend the short evening of her life, is extremely painful to her; and the prayer of the said petition appearing reasonable, therefore,

Jullices to levy money, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of Anne-Arundel county shall be and they are hereby directed and empowered, at their levy courts annually as long as they, in their discretion, may think proper, to assess and levy on said county a sum of money, not exceeding thirty dollars, for the support and maintenance of the said Mary Williams, and that the said fum be collected and paid to the aforesaid Mary Williams, by the collector or collectors of Anne-Arundel county, for the purposes aforesaid, agreeable to the order of the levy court of said county.

C H A P. LXIII.

An ACT to prevent the going at large of geefe and swine in the towns of Upper-Marlborough and Nottingham, in Prince-George's county. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 128.

No geefe, &c. to go at large,

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That from and after the first day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, no geese or swine shall be suffered to go at large in the towns of Upper-Marlborough or Nottingham, in Prince-George's county; and if any person shall find any geese or swine going at large in the towns of Upper-Marlborough or Nottingham aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for such person to kill, or cause to be killed, fuch geele or fwine.
