C H A P. LXIV. No person to be entitled to the benefit of this n& but a citizen, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That no person before mentioned shall be entitled to the benefit of any of the provisions of this act, unless the chancellor shall be satisfied, by competent testimony, that he is, and at the time of the passing of this act was, a citizen of the United States, and of this flate, and unless, at the time of presenting his petition as aforesaid, he shall produce to the chancellor, the affent, in writing, of formany of his creditors as have due to them the amount of two thirds of the debts due by him at the time of the passing of this act; provided, that foreign creditors, not refiding in the United States, and not having agents or attornies refiding therein duly empowered to act in their behalf, shall not be considered within the intent and meaning of this clause; and provided also, that the chancellor may, without the affent of the creditors as aforefaid, from time to time order to be discharged from custody any of the said petitioners who may be in actual confinement in virtue of any process issued, or that may be issued, in pursuance of any debt at this time due and owing by him, which discharge is hereby declared to be a release only of the person of fuch debtor, but not of his property, unless the affent in writing of two thirds in value of the creditors as aforefaid be obtained.

Traffee to give bond, &c.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED. That before such trustee proceeds to act, he shall give bond for the faithful performance of his duty, to fuch perfon, in trust for the creditors of faid petitioning debtor, and in fuch penalty as the chancellor shall direct; which shall be recorded in the office of the regilter of the court of chancery, and a copy thereof, certified under the hand of the faid regilter, -fliall be good evidence in any court of law or equity of this flate; and if any truffee, appointed by virtue of this act, shall refuse to act, or die, or neglect to give bond as aforesaid, in a reasonable time to be judged of by the chancellor, or be removed by the chancellor for missehaviour, he shall appoint fuch other person as he shall think proper in his place, who shall give bond as aforesaid, and on giving fuch bond, (in case the said debtor had conveyed his property to the former trustee,) he shall immediately be vested with all the property of every kind, and all the debts, rights and credits, of the faid debtor, as completely as the former truftee was vested with the fame.

By ch. 102, if the chancellor is fatisfied that a truftee has left the flate, and that the creditors are likely to fuffer, he may, on application, appoint a person to take into his care the property within the state, and retain it till surther order, and may pass and have published an order for the trustee to appear and account, and on default to appoint another in his room.

On executing a deed, debtor to be discharged,

V. And he it enacted. That upon the faid petitioning debtor's executing and acknowledging a deed to the trustee to be appointed as aforesaid, conveying all his property, real, personal and mixed, and all debts, rights and claims, agreeably to the oath, or affirmation, of fuch debtor as aforefaid, and on his delivery to the faid truftee of all his faid property which he shall have in possession, and of his books, papers, and evidences of debts of every kind, and the faid truftee's certifying the fame, in writing, to the chancellor, it shall be lawful for the chancellor to order that the faid debtor shall be discharged from all debts, covenants, contracts, promises and agreements, due from, or owing or contracted by, him, before the date of the faid deed, and by virtue of fuch order the faid debtor shall be discharged as aforesaid; provided, that no person who has been guilty of a breach of the laws, and hath been fined, or is liable to be fined, for such breach, shall be discharged from the payment of any fine incurred for any breach of the laws of this state; and provided, that any property which he shall thereafter acquire by gift, descent, or in his own right by bequest, devife, or in any course of distribution, shall be liable to the payment of the faid debt; and provided, that the discharge of such debtor shall not operate so as to discharge any other person from any

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the chancellor may allow such petitioning debtor to retain the May retain his apparel. necessary wearing apparel of himself and family.

-Truffee may be direacd to fell,

VII. And BE IT ENACTED, That the chancellor may direct any trustee to be appointed by virtue of this act to fell and convey the property conveyed to him by the petitioning debtor, at fuch time, and on such terms and conditions, as he shall think most for the advantage of the creditors, and the produce thereof, after fatisfying all incumbrances and liens, shall be divided among the said creditors, agreeably to their feveral and respective claims; but no judgment to be rendered after the passage of this act against any of the said debtors who shall take advantage of this act, shall be a lien on his real property, nor shall any process against his real or personal property have any effect thereon, except writs of fieri facias actually and bona fide laid before the paffing of this act.

And may fue,

VIII. And BE IT ENACTED, That any trustee may sue for, in his own name, and recover, any property or debts affigued to him by any debtor in virtue of this act.
