E IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for any citi- Slaves may be Den and resident of this state, or of any adjoining state, being seized and possessed of an estate removed, &c. of inheritance in his own right, or in the right of his wife, in land lying in this or any one of the adjoining states, and the owner of any slave or slaves employed or worked on the faid land, to remove and bring fuch flave or flaves within this state on the land of fuch owner, for the use and benefit of the owner, his or her. legal representatives, and not for fale, provided such save or saves hath or have been resident of this or some one of the said adjoining states before the twenty-first day of April, in the year one thouland feven hundred and eighty-three, or is or are the descendant or descendants. of any slave being residents as aforesaid; and provided also, that a list of such slave or flaves, containing their names, fexes and ages, be delivered, in writing, and figned by the owner, his overfeer or agent, to the clerk of the county into which fuch flave or flaves shall be brought to refide, within three months thereafter; and the faid lift shall be recorded at the expence of the owner of fuch flave or flaves to brought into this flate, in which lift of negroes; to recorded, if title to them be acquired by will, the tellator's name, the date of the will, and the place where recorded,

THEREAS a great number of the inhabitants of Montgomery county have, by their petition Preamble to this general assembly represented, that great inconvenience arises from the want of a road to the filheries at and below, the little falls of Patowmack river, and the neighbourhood thereof, and to Peirce's mill on Rock creek, where, in dry seasons, the neighbourhood can calculate that the grain necessary to support their families will be ground; and this general assembly being satisfied that the prayer of the faid petition is just and reasonable,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That John Threlkeld, Joseph Sprigg Belt Commissioners and Isac Peirce, be and hereby are appointed commissioners for the purposes in this act mentioned; appointed, &c. and that the faid commissioners, or any two of them, are hereby authorised and empowered to lay off
