by the name of The Trustees of George town School for the purposes of receiving, holding and C.H.A.P. directing, funds for the benefit of faid school, and managing the interest and concerns thereof; which faid perlons, to nominated truftees for George town school, and their successors, to be appointed the manner herein after prescribed, shall and are hereby declared to be one community, corporation and body politic, to have continuation for ever, by the name of The Trustees of George-town School, and by that name to fue and be fued, implead or be impleaded, and to make and have a common feal, and the fame to break, alter or renew, when and fo often as they shall think fit.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the aforefaid trustees, and their successors, or a majority of How vacancies them, shall, at any and at all times, upon the death, refignation, or removal from the counties of are to be filled. Kent and Cecil, of any one or more of the trustees, appoint other sensible and discreet man or men of the faid counties to be the truftee or truftees to fill the vacancy created by the death, refignation or removal, as aforefaid.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED. That the faid trustees, and their successors, or a majority of them, Trustees to shall have full power and authority to make fundamental ordinances for the government of the school make ordior seminary aforesaid, and the education of the youth, and to appoint such person or persons as they, or a majority of them, may think proper, to be teacher or teachers of the faid school.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid trustees, and their successors, or a majority of them, Meet twice in shall meet at least twice in each year, at such times as shall be appointed by their own ordinances, in order to examine the progress of the students and scholars, and to hear and determine on all complaints and appeals, and all matters touching the discipline of the seminary, and the good and wholesome execution of their ordinances, on all which occasions a majority at least of the trustees shall. compose a quorum.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid trustees, and their successors, may hold and enjoy, and And may hold: that they may be apt and capable in law for taking, holding and enjoying, all lands, tenements, rents, property, &c. fervices, portions, annuities and pensions, with all other inheritances, franchises and possessions whatloever, of the gift of any person whatsoever that is willing to bestow them, for the use of the school aforesaid, or any other gifts, grants, affignments, legacies or donations, of any and all kinds. whatever, for the use and benefit of said school.

C H A P. LXXIX.

A Supplement to the act, \* entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Passed 16th of Jan. 1799. Forrest, of George-town, Patowmack, and Thomas Earle, of Chapter 26. Queen-Anne's county. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 156.

HEREAS the act to which this is a supplement gives no power or authority to the chancellor Preamble. to bring Joseph Forrest and Thomas Earle, or either of them, before him, in case either of the faid persons should be imprisoned at the time of exhibiting his or their petition,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the chancellor have and possess the same powers and authorities in relation to the said persons, or either of them, as are given to have certain the chancellor in certain cases under the ninth section of the act, \* entitled, An act for the relief of \* Chapter 64. fundry infolvent debtors, palled at the prefent feffior of allembly.

C H A P. LXXX.

An ACT to lay out and establish a road from the city of Annapolis to the city of Washington, and to repeal the act therein mentioned. Lib. IG. No. 3, fol. 156.

WHEREAS by a refolve of the general assembly, passed at November session, one thousand Preamble. Seven hundred and ninety-fix, commissioners were authorised and empowered to examine the fituation of the country, between the city of Washington and the city of Annapolis, and ascertain and determine the direction and polition of the nearest, most convenient and practicable road, that could be laid off between the faid two places, and report the fame, with a plot thereof, to the next general affembly: And whereas the faid commissioners have undertaken and completed the same, and returned a plor of the faid road, and it appearing from faid plot; that the faid commissioners have carried the road in such a direction that it will pass over the Eastern Branch, one mile, or there-
