PROVIDED ALWAYS, AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid Nicholas Watkins, before he pro- Provito. ceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons for taxes, shall, at least ten days before such execution or distress, deliver to the person chargeable with the same an account, written in words at full length, of all the taxes demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavir annexed to the fame, that he hath not, to the best of his knowledge, received any part thereof, nor any thing in security or satisfaction for the same, more than the credits given; and provided also, that the faid Nicholas Watkins, before he derives any benefit from or under this act, shall lodge his collection books in the clerk's office of Anne-Arundel county court, to be there open to the inspection of all persons interested in the same.

C H A P. XCIX.

An ACT to authorife an exchange of lands between John Eversfield and the other representatives Passed 19th of of Matthew Eversfield, late of Prince-George's county. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 175. A Private Act. Jan. 1799.

C H A P. C.

A Supplement to the act, * entitled, An act to regulate and discipline • 1793, ch. 53. the militia of this state. Lib. JG. No. 3. fol. 176.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That if any person, whose duty it shall be Penalty for not to meet and muster under the provisions of this act, or the act to which this is a supplement, attending, &c. fliall not attend on any day of meeting prescribed by any officer authorised to require the same, or attending, shall refuse to do the duties of his station at such meeting, such person, if a non-commissioned officer or private, shall, at the diferetion of a company court-martial, to be appointed as herein after directed, be fined a fum not less than seventy-five cents, nor exceeding five dollars; and if a commifficied officer shall refuse or neglect to attend at any company, battalion or regimental meeting, he shall be fined; at the discretion of a regimental court-martial, not less than five dollars, nor more than fifty dollars.

II. And BE IT ENACTED, That the captain, or other commanding officer of each company, shall Captain to apappoint the non-commissioned officers of his company, and if any person so appointed shall accept, point the nonand neglect to do the duties annexed to his appointment, or refuse or neglect to obey the orders of commissioned officers, &c. his superior officers, he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten dollars, in the discretion of the commissioned officers of the company, without a sufficient excuse for his resulal or neglect.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in all cases where such line or fines may be incurred in conse- Court-martial quence of non-attendance, or otherwife, the court-martial fliall, at the next meeting day of the to hear excuses, company, and at the place of such meeting, proceed to hear and determine on the excuses of every fuch delinquent, and if fuch delinquent shall, on fuch hearing, be adjudged liable to a fine, or if fach person shall not attend on notice, without a good excuse for said neglect, and thereupon be considered liable to a fine, the captain, or other officer, (as the case may be,) commanding the said company, shall, within two months thereafter, make return of faid lines so imposed and remaining unpaid, to the lieutenant-colonel commanding the regiment, or commanders of extra battalions; and if any captain or other commanding officer as aforefaid shall neglect or refuse as aforefaid, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars, and the lieutenant-colonel or commander of an extra battalison shall place such fine in the list to be delivered to the theriff, and the same shall be collected by him, and paid over and applied as other fines are to be collected, paid over and applied, under this act.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED. That all officers removing out of the county, or, if a general officer, Officers re. out of his district, with an intention of making a permanent residence, shall, on such removal, be moving deemed deemed to have refigned his commission; and it shall be the duty of every officer commanding a regiment, or extra battalion, to make known any vacancy which may take place as foon as convenient after fuch vacancy shall happen, to the brigadier, or officer commanding the brigade, who is hereby required to report the same to the adjutant-general as soon as may be thereaster.
