

CLERKS.

County clerks to grant licence to sell liquor at a horse race by the direction of a justice of the peace. *Ibid.* ch. 7, § 13, ch. 37, § 33.

Manner of enrolling deeds transmitted from the general court to the county courts, or from the county courts to the general court. 1785, ch. 9, § 4, 7.

Manner of transmitting extracts of deeds by the county clerks to the clerk of the general court, to be recorded. *Ibid.*

Fees allowed therefor. *Ibid.* § 7.

Directions to the clerks respecting writs of replevin issued for property taken for public uses. *Ibid.* ch. 34, 1790, ch. 53.

County clerks may protest inland bills of exchange or orders drawn by a citizen of another state on a person in this state. 1785, ch. 38, § 2.

Their fee for such protest. *Ibid.*

County clerks to record recognizances taken by justices of the peace from the fathers of illegitimate children. *Ibid.* ch. 47, § 2.

To issue *scire facias* on such recognizances, on proof as therein prescribed. 1796, ch. 34, § 2.

The commissioners of the tax may call on the county clerks for lists of assessment, &c. before taken, and lists of alienations as therein mentioned. 1785, ch. 53, § 5.

County clerks directed to read aloud at the March and April courts the act to prevent the inconveniences of slaves being permitted to act as free. April, 1787, ch. 33, § 4.

County clerks to keep books for the sole purpose of entering the declaration of the justices on voting for any public warehouse or inspector of tobacco. 1789, ch. 25, § 6.

Inspectors bonds to be recorded by the county clerks, and transmitted to the clerks of the general court, who shall record them, and deliver them to the register of the chancery court. *Ibid.* § 15.

The county clerks shall record the proceedings of the justices under the act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, and shall attend them at their meetings. *Ibid.* § 42.

Clerks directed to issue executions on the order of the president of the bank of Maryland in the manner therein mentioned. 1790, ch. 5, § 13.

To issue in like manner on the order of the president of the bank of Columbia. 1793, ch. 30, § 14.

Duty of the county clerks respecting the polls on an election for representatives in congress. 1790, ch. 16, § 9.

Penalty on county clerks delivering the acts of assembly and the votes and proceedings to persons to whom they are not directed. 1790, ch. 51, § 14.

Application to be made to the county clerks by commissioners under the act for marking and bounding lands for attachments against witnesses not attending. 1793, ch. 70, § 3.

To furnish copies of the assessment for the governor and council, and for the collectors. *Ibid.*

To record the collectors bonds. *Ibid.*

Clerks directed to issue executions to an ellisor when appointed by a judge or justice. *Ibid.* ch. 54, § 5.

Sheriffs bonds to be delivered to the county clerks, to be recorded by them, and copies to be transmitted to the clerks of the general court. *Ibid.* § 8.

County clerks shall, before issuing a writ on any administration bond, &c. endorse thereon the names of the parties at

whose instance, and for whose use, the writ was instituted. *Ibid.* § 10.

Clerks of the court of appeals, general court, or any county or levy court, when the courts do not meet at the time prescribed, are empowered and required to adjourn their courts from day to day, till the meeting of the judges or justices. 1795, ch. 55, § 1.

County clerks to transmit annually, on or before the tenth of November, to the treasurer, lists of executions for fines, and of the sums acknowledged to be received therefor by the sheriffs. *Ibid.* ch. 5, § 5.

Duty of the clerks on attachments by warrant against persons out of the state. *Ibid.* ch. 56.

The chief justice, or an associate justice, may, out of court, direct the county clerk to enter judgments by confession, or *non sum informatus*. 1796, ch. 43, § 20.

County clerks directed to certify, under seal, the amount of the assessable property in their counties, and to lodge one certificate with each of the clerks in the district. *Ibid.* § 27.

To make out in November yearly two copies of the levy list, containing the several charges, and transmit one copy to each branch of the legislature. *Ibid.* § 23.

Lists of slaves brought into the state, (as therein permitted,) to be delivered to the county clerks within three months, and to be recorded at the expence of the owner. 1796, ch. 67, § 8, 9, 10, 11, 1798, ch. 76.

County clerks to record the certificates of the oath of the sheriffs returned to them. 1797, ch. 87, § 2.

The clerks of the general court directed to return annually, on or before the 20th of November, to the general assembly, an account of certificates issued to jurymen. *Ibid.* ch. 94, § 3.

Manner of compelling payment by the county clerks to the treasurers of money collected for the chief justice of the district. *Ibid.* ch. 69, § 5.

The clerks of the general courts directed to make out from their records lists of the alienations of all land thereby granted, bargained or sold, since 1792, expressing the names of the parties, of the lands, and the quantity, for the commissioners of the tax, and to make out the like list annually in March. *Ibid.* ch. 89, § 38.

Clerks of the general or county courts shall not be appointed commissioners of the tax or assessors. *Ibid.* § 2.

The commissioners of the tax empowered to call on the clerks of their counties for a list of alienations from the first of June, 1797, to their first meeting, and so from time to time, and for a list of all transfers of personal property which shall be recorded in their offices, and which take place after the assessment of property under this act. *Ibid.* § 8.

Summary accounts of the assessments to be delivered by the clerks of the commissioners of the tax to the county clerks, to be recorded. *Ibid.* § 27.
