

## FINES AND FORFEITURES.

On persons who, having voted, offer to vote again in the same district or county, 10 dollars. *Ibid.* § 12.

On persons voting in names not their own, or in the place of any other person of the same name, 10 dollars. *Ibid.*

On persons residing out of the district or county offering to vote therein, 10 dollars. *Ibid.*

On persons residing out of the state offering to vote therein, 20 dollars. *Ibid.*

On persons voting twice at one election, 40 dollars. *Ibid.* § 13.

On the judges not attending as therein directed to examine and return the votes and ballots, 300 dollars. *Ibid.* § 15.

On candidates or other persons practising force and violence at an election, not exceeding 250 dollars. *Ibid.* § 17.

On persons giving or promising any gift or reward to secure any person's vote, not exceeding 500 dollars. *Ibid.* § 18.

On the commissioners for laying off the election districts not signifying their refusal by the time therein prescribed, and failing to perform the duties under this act, 50 dollars. *Ibid.* § 21.

Fines by this act to be recovered by indictment.

The agent authorised to superintend the collection of all fines and forfeitures. 1799, ch. 80, § 4.

Forfeiture on persons cutting up tobacco plants belonging to other persons, to the party grieved, £. 100. 1744, ch. 5.

Fines to be recovered before a justice of the peace, viz.

For not appearing at the clearing of the highways in the counties not included in the acts of 1794, &c. for every labourer 100 lbs. tobacco; the master for every servant not sent out, 100 lbs. tobacco. 1704, ch. 21, § 4, 1723, ch. 17.

On persons refusing, when required, to repair with the constable to suspected places, 100 lbs. tobacco. 1723, ch. 15, § 3.

On persons being present refusing to aid the constable in preventing the meeting of negroes, &c. 100 lbs. tobacco. *Ibid.*

On persons encouraging negroes or other slaves to meet in companies on their plantations, except on lawful occasions, 1000 lbs. tobacco. *Ibid.* § 5.

On the owners of negroes, &c. suffering them to keep horses, or to raise cattle or hogs, as their own, 500 lbs. tobacco. *Ibid.* § 6.

For profanely swearing or cursing before a magistrate, &c. for the first oath 2/6, and for every oath or curse after, 5s. *Ibid.* ch. 46, § 2.

For being drunk in the presence of such magistrate, &c. 5s. *Ibid.* § 3.

On persons working or doing any bodily labour on Sunday, or that having children, servants or slaves, shall command or willingly suffer them so to work, (except works of necessity or charity,) or to profane the Lord's day by gaming, fishing, &c. or unlawful recreations, 200 lbs. tobacco. *Ibid.* § 10.

For hunting in any enclosed grounds, islands, peninsulas or necks, fenced from water to water, without leave, 200 lbs. tobacco. 1728, ch. 7, § 7.

On persons setting up barrels for pork, &c. of less size than herein directed, for every barrel 2/6. 1745, ch. 15, § 3.

Packing pork or beef in less quantities than herein prescribed, for every barrel 10s. *Ibid.* § 4.

Selling barrels of pork, &c. of less size or quantity, for every barrel 10s. *Ibid.* § 5.

Selling tar, turpentine or pitch, in barrels or in quality contrary to this act, for every barrel 2/6. *Ibid.* § 6.

For barrels of pork, tar, &c. so imported, the same fines. *Ibid.* § 7.

On persons not marking barrels of flour or bread for sale, for every barrel 5s. *Ibid.* § 8.

On county clerks not attending at the court-houses as therein directed, 600 lbs. tobacco. 1748, ch. 7, § 3.

On persons entertaining servants or slaves, for every hour, 100 lbs. tobacco. *Ibid.* ch. 19, § 2.

If not exceeding 600 lbs. tobacco to be recovered before a single magistrate. *Ibid.*

On county clerks omitting to signify the appointments of constables under their hands, and to deliver them to the sheriffs within five days, 20s. 1752, ch. 7, § 2.

On sheriffs neglecting to deliver or leave such appointments within ten days, 20s. *Ibid.*

On county clerks not bringing their four last court dockets and papers, 30s. September, 1770, ch. 10, § 2.

On ordinary-keepers harbouring, entertaining, or selling liquors to an apprentice or servant, without leave in writing, 160 lbs. tobacco. March, 1780, ch. 24, § 17.

On persons keeping ferry without licence, £. 5. November, 1781, ch. 22, § 1.

On licensed persons for not setting up in their houses a copy of the licence and the price allowed, for every day such copy shall not be set up £. 5. *Ibid.* § 2.

On asking or receiving more than the price allowed, 20s. *Ibid.*

On persons licensed to keep ferry across the Chesapeake omitting to keep an anchor, yawl, &c. £. 10. November, 1788, ch. 33.

On licensed retailers of spirituous liquors not selling by sealed measures, 20s. 1784, ch. 7, § 10, ch. 37, § 27.

On their retailing such liquors between the hours of eleven at night on Saturdays and five in the morning on Mondays, 40s. *Ibid.* ch. 7, § 12, ch. 37, § 29.

On persons permitting a slave, (not being a pilot,) to go at large or hire himself, except at harvest, for every month £. 5. April, 1787, ch. 33, § 1.

On persons hiring such slaves by contract, for every month, £. 5. *Ibid.* § 2.

For holding fairs or setting up booths at any public meetings to sell or exchange any goods, &c. £. 5. 1790, ch. 15, § 2.

On the trustees of the poor neglecting to lodge indentures of apprenticeship taken by them with the county clerks, £. 3. 1791, ch. 21, § 2, 1793, ch. 24.

For making a wear or hedge on Rock creek within two miles of Patowmack river, £. 10. November, 1792, ch. 61, § 3.

For fishing such wear or hedge, £. 5. *Ibid.* § 4.

On clerks neglecting to deliver to the sheriffs warrants for the supervisors of the public roads within ten days after they are ordered, £. 5. 1794, ch. 52, § 8.

On sheriffs neglecting to deliver such warrants to the supervisors, £. 5. *Ibid.*

On supervisors failing in any part of their duty on the roads, unless the money should be expended, £. 5. *Ibid.* § 9, 10.

On parish registers refusing to enrol any person of the protestant episcopal church applying therefor on the books of the parish, 8 dollars. 1798, ch. 24, § 3.

Refusing to enter any baptism, marriage or burial, in the parish, made known to them, 8 dollars. *Ibid.* § 21.

On ministers or vestrymen failing in the duties therein assigned them, 8 dollars. *Ibid.*

On vestrymen neglecting or refusing to appoint a register, or to provide him with record books, 5 dollars. *Ibid.* § 23.

Absenting themselves from any meeting without an excuse allowed by the rest, not less than two dollars, nor more than 8 dollars. *Ibid.* § 25.

On registers not giving to vestrymen convenient notice of their election, 20 dollars. *Ibid.* § 26.

On vestrymen so notified refusing to serve, unless excused as therein allowed, 20 dollars. *Ibid.*
