

TOBACCO INSPECTION.

Directions to the justices to meet, and determine on the buildings, &c. wanting at the several warehouses, and to appoint two of the said justices to contract therefor. 1789, ch. 26, § 44.

Such justices to contract with the proprietors, and on their neglect to give bond as therein directed, to contract with other persons. *Ibid.*

Penalty on the said two justices for neglect or omission. *Ibid.* § 46.

The bond so taken to be lodged with the county clerks. *Ibid.* § 45.

Provision made for payment of the sums so contracted for by the two justices aforesaid. *Ibid.* § 47.

The justices empowered at any time of the year to put in execution so much of this act as relates to the building and repairing of public warehouses, making wharfs, &c. *Ibid.* § 48, 1790, ch. 55, § 7.

Provision made for payment of money due to the proprietors of warehouses under the former inspection law. 1789, ch. 26, § 49.

Directions for the delivery over of tobacco by inspectors to the persons who may be appointed in their place, who are to be answerable therefor, &c. *Ibid.* § 50.

Penalty on inspectors, if warehouses are burnt by them wilfully or for want of care. *Ibid.* § 51.

Allowance to the justices attending to agree for repairs, &c. and to the inspectors meeting them. *Ibid.* § 52.

Penalty on persons carrying or attempting to carry away tobacco which the inspectors may refuse to pass, or direct to lie. *Ibid.* § 53.

The inspectors to weigh and give receipts for tobacco if required, which shall be returned when the tobacco is inspected, and notes given. *Ibid.* § 54.

Penalty on persons, (other than the inspectors,) making a fire within any public warehouse, or without doors within the space of fifty yards. *Ibid.* § 55.

Punishment of slaves so offending. *Ibid.*

Penalty on persons erecting woden chimnies within one hundred yards of any public warehouse, and power given to demolish such chimnies. *Ibid.* § 56.

When special bail shall be awarded on actions founded on this act. *Ibid.* § 57.

Provision made for purchasing or condemning land whereon to erect public warehouses, and for building the same. *Ibid.* § 58.

This act to be given in charge to the grand jury. *Ibid.* § 59.

The justices directed yearly to inquire into the number of warehouses and inspectors, the quantity of tobacco inspected, &c. and to transmit their determination respecting the continuance or suppression of the warehouses, and respecting the number of inspectors required, to the governor and council, who may thereupon increase or diminish the number of inspectors as therein prescribed. *Ibid.*

The warehouses which may be discontinued under the above powers directed to be sold, if belonging to the county. *Ibid.*

Allowance to the inspectors, and to the proprietors of warehouses. *Ibid.* § 60, 1793, ch. 47, § 4, 1795, ch. 71, § 5, 1799, ch. 87.

Charges to be paid for warehouse room. 1789, ch. 26, § 6.

In actions for any thing done in this act, the persons may plead the general issue, and give this act, &c. in evidence. *Ibid.* § 62.

Prosecutions and actions for the recovery of penalties, &c. for any breach of this act, to be commenced within one year. *Ibid.* § 63.

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Actions against persons making any seizure, or doing any thing in consequence of this act, to be brought within one year. *Ibid.*
