and whereas the Kings most excellent Maj<sup>ty</sup> hath  
in Protection of our Right bene gratically pleased by  
his Ltes directed among others to all Captains and m<sup>en</sup>  
of Shippes trading into Maryland to require them to be  
aiding and assisting to our officers in the settling of  
our Jurisdiction there; Wee doe hereby Authorize you at  
your Next arrivall in Maryland you find the Said fendants  
or any others there to continue in opposition to our  
Jurisdiction in that Province to Arrest and apprehend  
by your selves or any officer or officers by you to be  
appointed him and them or any one or more of them  
and him and them or any one or more of them to keepe  
in safe and strict Custody untill further order from  
our Ltes or Comitt<sup>ee</sup> for the Government of the Said Province  
for the time coming and if he or they or any one or more  
of them in opposition as aforesaid shall resist and not  
quietly yield upon demand their bodies to such arrest  
then to use what force you shall be able and thinke  
needfull to Compell and suborne him and them or any  
one or more of them and to seise upon any vessels  
Armes, servants, Merchandise or other goods what-  
soever appertaining to him and them or any one  
or more of them And to have and hold the same  
to your bene use and property, for all w<sup>ch</sup> this shall  
be your warrant Given under our hand and  
greater seale at Anno this 24<sup>th</sup> day of August  
in y<sup>e</sup> nine and twentieth yeare of our Dominion  
over Maryland and in the yeare of our Lord God  
one thousand six hundred and Sixty —
