the before recited Acts of parliament  
heretofore passed and now in force, relate  
to Our Colonies and plantations be put into  
& bona fide observed according to the true  
intent and meaning thereof.

AND as by the last recited Act the  
Officers appointed by the Governors for  
performance of certain things mentioned  
the aforesaid Act for the Encouragement of  
Trade commonly known by the Name of  
of the Naval Officers, are to give Security to  
the Commission<sup>ers</sup> of Our Customs in London  
for the time being, or such as shall be  
appointed by them for Our use for the  
true and faithfull performance of their  
Duty
