W^hereas by an Act passed in the
 10th Year of King William 3^d ^{4th Reign of} to prevent
 the Exportation of Wool out of the
 Kingdoms of Ireland and England into
 Foreign parts, and for the Encouragement
 of the Woollen Manufactures in the
 Kingdom of England, it is amongst other
 things thereby Enacted, That from and
 after the first day of Decemb. 1699, No
 Wool, Wool-fells, Shortlings, Worlings,
 Woolflocks, Worsted Bay or Woollen Yarn,
 Coath, Serge, Bays, Kerseys, Sayes, Fries,
 Druggetts, Cloth Serges Shalcoos or any other
 Drapery Stuffs or Woollen Manufactures
 whatsoever, made or mixed with Wool or
 Woolflocks, being of the product or
 Manufacture of any of the English
 Plantations
