My quit Rents and Alienation Fines being payable in Money  
 Sterling and almost all the Species in the Province being Foreign Gold / Great  
 part of which is cutt into small pieces for the Convenience of Change & reckoned  
 according to the Common Computation not warranted by any Law the  
 Ounces at ----- £ 4 : 2 : 6

Whereas Gold is worth Intrinsicly no more than ----- £ 3 : 18 : 4

It that at this Rate my loss would be in every Ounce of Gold ----- £ 0 : 4 : 2

It would not be all for the Paper Currency has already (the not in Circulation)  
 the Value of Bills of Exchange which is not Doubled will reach to 4% Cent  
 and the Treasurer has the Money Remitted in Specie with the
