 " Council, & the Ministers & Clergy of the Province of Maryland,
 " which petitions represent (amongst other things) that great
 " Disorders & Outrages have been committed upon the Borders of
 " the s^d respective provinces, & humbly praying Your Majesty's
 " Most gracious Interposition & Command for the preservation
 " of the peace on the s^d Borders, until the Boundaries of the
 " said provinces shall be finally settled & adjusted.

" The Lords of the Com^{tee} of Council did, on the 29th of the
 " month of July, take the matter of the s^d Complaint
 " into their Consideration, & thereupon Reported to your
 " Majesty what they thought most advisable for your Majesty
 " to do in order to prevent the farther Continuance of the
 " said Disorders, & to preserve Peace & Tranquility on the s^d
 " Borders, until the Boundaries should be finally settled: And
 " your Majesty having approved of what was proposed by
 " the s^d Report, was pleased, by your Order in Council
 " of the 18th of Aug^r 1737, to Direct as follows viz
