

in the Name of the Agent of the s^d Province of Pennsylvania,
Complaining of fresh Disorders committed by the Inhabitants of
Maryland ag^t those of Pennsylvania — Whereupon the
Lords of the Comtee did, on the 23^d of Febr^y. last, proceed
to take all the papers relating to the Complaints made by
each of the s^d Provinces into their Consideration & were
attended by Counsel on both sides, likewise by the
Proprietors of the s^d Provinces, & the Counsel desiring
if some reasonable time might be allowed the Proprietors
to confer together, in order to come to some Agreement
amongst themselves, y^t: so the Peace & Tranquility of
both Provinces may be preserved, until such time as the
Boundaries can be finally settled — The Lords of the
Committee thought proper to comply with such their
request — And being again this day attended by all
parties, the Counsel acquainted the Comtee y^t: the
Proprietors of each Province had accordingly met &
agreed to the following Propositions.

As there is recited the 8 Propositions of w^{ch}
herein is a Copy; folios 31: 32: e 33 — Each Agreement
copied, was sent the gov^r of Maryland May 17th 1763

To which Propositions the Proprietors of each Province
signified their Consent before the Committee, & declared
their readiness to carry the same into execution if your
Majesty shall be pleased to approve thereof — And the
Committee considering that this Agreement may be a
proper Expedient for restoring Peace & Tranquility
between the s^d Provinces, & for preventing any the like
Disturbances for the future, Do therefore Agree humbly
to lay the same before y^r Maj^{ty} for y^r Royal approbation
