Sheweth

That an Act was passed in the said
 Province of Maryland anno 1725 Entitled an Act to
 Restrain the ill practice of Attorneys & to prevent
 their taking Money Fees, & ascertaining what Fees shall
 be allowed to Practitioners in the Law who shall attend the
 Circuit Courts which Act continued in Force till July 1729
 and by another Act then passed was continued 3 years longer.

 put under so many Difficultys & Hardships y^t many of the
 Prac^{ers}: were necessitated to leave off their practice
