Qu¹ Whether by the Charter of Maryland the
Lord Proprietor has not a Right to the Nomination
of all Officers in general, civil as well as military?

Ans^r I am of opinion that by the Charter of Maryland
the Lord Proprietor has a Right to nominate & appoint
all officers in general, as well civil as military.

Qu² Whether there is any thing particular in the
Nature of the Office of Treasurer of either Shore
to Exempt it from the 1st Nomination?

Ans^r It does not appear to me that there is any thing
particular in the nature of the Office of Treasurer of
either Shore, as to take the Right of Nomination to this
office, from the Lord Proprietor, & to give it to any
other persons.

Qu³ Whether a few precedents in this Case, of a
Treasurer being appointed by the Tripartite concurrence
of both Houses of Assembly & the Governor, can
or doe overthrow his Lordship's Right? —
