

Ans<sup>r</sup>: All the precedents except one, being between 1692 and 1716, when my Lord Baltimore was out of possession I am of opinion that they will not overthrow his Lord's Right, founded upon such plain words in the Charter.

Qu<sup>st</sup>: Whether the precedents have annexed, & divest the Proprietor of his Right of Nomination to the Office of Treasurer or Treasurers so nominated giving the Security the Law directs?

Ans<sup>r</sup>: The Treasurer or Treasurers when nominated by the Lord Proprietor, must give such Security as the Law directs.
