cause of Balance due to me, to be immediately paid  
into hands of any Agent

And for an Encouragement to Mr Onorio  
Razolini, who for his pains & trouble he has had  
in discovering this fraud, or mistake, out of the  
to be paid by Mr Philip Thomas, I desire you  
will present him with one Hundred Pounds, and  
that of Particulars of this Acco<sup>t</sup> be transmitted  
to me, and you are likewise to thank Mr Onorio  
Razolini on my Behalf.
