By this Packet inclosed you have my Commission
of appointment as Secretary of the Province of Maryland,
signed by the Lord Proprietary and his Guardians, with
a Letter from his Lordship et from Mr. Sharpe, on a reasonable
Salary to be annexed and paid for the execution of the said
office as Secretary for home affairs to the Province.
I hope it will meet with your approbation and friendship, I shall
esteem your Endeavours and Compliance therewith an Obligation,
likewise the same from each particular Person concerned, and
I request the favour of You to notifye the same to them,
and that You will gain from each their Acquiescence thereto,
by an order on their Correspondence in London for Payment to
my Use as per date of my Commission and agreeable to My Lords
Proprietarys Letter to You concerning the same, You may
depend Your Establishment to me therein will be by me returned
with Due Acknowledgement.

I shall be always glad of your Advice and Correspondence
on all matters relative to my Nephews Provincial Affairs, and You
may rely on the justness of my Correspondence. The Dependants
have not as yet brought any Bill of Revivor, 'tis thought they
will not, the articles between the late Lord Proprietary and them
being regarded here in Law to be void; the late Lord being only
Tenant for Life, therefore could not bind his Son the Tenant in
Tail.
