

As to Instructions, the Lord Proprietary and his Guardians rely You have, and will proceed as by their Instructions to the Governor, ordering him that all Affairs in the Province, as to Offices and the Officers in such capacities should be continued and go on in transactions as was in and at the late Proprietarys Death, without alteration; all new Matter to rest until they should receive an account of the Governours having put the machine of Publick Affairs in motion by the Authority of their Commission to him for that purpose.

The List dated the 16<sup>th</sup> of September 1752. with the Bills of Exchange, value £. 1546. 6. 7. your amount by Difference on W<sup>m</sup> Hamiltons Bill £ 5. Increases the value to £. 1551. 6. 7. The said Bill are with the Executors. I think You would do right to distinguish all Money Bills arising to the present Lord, as I apprehend they will properly fall under account to his Guardians, distinct from the Executors, due to the late Lord.

I desire You will send me a Copy of Your Commission of appointment as Agent and Receiver General, it being necessary to have such in England. I am with respect
