Yours of the 4<sup>th</sup> of May last I've received, wherein  
you acquaint me, that by Mr. Browning you understand that  
I have accepted of the office of Secretary to My Lord my  
Nephew; In which he has inform'd you right of my Ap=  
pointment by his Lordship and his Guardians to that office,  
as will more fully appear by their Commission to me entered  
and recorded in the Secretary's office of the Province, to which  
I refer you. — His Lordship by advice considering the  
Trouble and great Expence, that must certainly attend the  
Person residing near His Lordship's Person in England as Secretary  
with regard to his Province of Maryland, in as much as the said  
Secretary is obliged in Duty to attend and take his Directions at all  
times for the due Execution resulting from all offices, and in relation  
to all Publick and private Business for the wellbeing and carrying  
on his Government in all Branches and to all Persons concern'd in his  
Province; on such Consideration his Lordship wrote a Letter to his late  
Lieutenant Governor as to a Salary thereunto; To which Letter I also  
refer you, having no reason to doubt but that it is now by the Lieut=
