Dear Sir.

I have received your of the 6<sup>th</sup> of May last  
and return you my thanks, I am obliged to you for your  
kind offers therein made me, and shall always be ready  
for any instance whereby I can be truly of service to you,  
and you may depend of my sincerity therein; But in regard  
to the Legacy left you by my late Brother, as recited in his  
will, of Ann Arundel mannor in Maryland in prejudice  
of the Lord Proprietary his Son; I cannot take upon me  
to act as a mediator between you and him as you desire,  
The Property of the said mannor being vested absolutely in  
the present Proprietor Jr as much as his Father the late  
Lord was only Tenant for Life, with Reversion to his Son as  
Tenant in Tail, as fully appears by his Father's marriage Settle-  
ment, whereby he could not subject his Son to the Loss  
of any Landed Property either in Maryland or Avalon in America,  
or in the County of Surry in Great Britain, by any Donation.  
This being truly the case in regard to the late Lord's incapacity  
by Legacy to you of Ann Arundel mannor, what can I do therein?  
You say, it may have been represented to the Present Lord more  
considerable than it really is, But as it is at this present time  
before me under consideration by reason of the near Expiration  
of the Lease,
