In the interim, as nobody will be acquainted with this step, save such as are herein mentioned; I desire you will keep it an entire secret in the Province; I hope this my proposition of favour will be agreeable for your acceptance of which I desire your early advice, and that you'll believe me with peculiar Esteem.
