Postscript of the Hon^{ble} Cecilius Calverts Letter to the
Reverend Mr Thomas Bacon.

It will be a Pleasure to me to establish a Correspondence with You, as Your Residence is on that part of the Eastern Shore near the disputed Boundaries between the Lord Proprietary and the Penns; and as some Lines have been Run in respect to the late Lords Agreement with the Penns about the Boundaries which have not been confirmed from hence; by reason that the late Lords said Agreement is noways binding on the present Lord Proprietary, by virtue of his Fathers Marriage Articles; his Father being only Tenant for life with Remainder to the present Lord Proprietary his Son as Tenant in Tail. Therefore it would be of service to his Lordship to be inform'd from You, how the Tenants have thereupon acted with respect to the Present Tenures they Esteem them selves to hold under; especially those who have always been the Tenants of Maryland. And in case any of them have been prevailed on to act otherwise, your good offices in setting them right, will receive all due marks of his Lordship's Favour.
