of Calvert County, I cannot suppose could slip your know-
ledge, altho' you who are the proper channel of such intelli-
gence have been silent thereon. But I having been ac-
quainted thereof from Maryland by several in the Administration
of the Government there, have laid the same before his Lordship's
Guardians & the Lord Proprietary who is arrived from his
Travels abroad: And I could have wish'd the same intelli-
gence had also come from you, as I should have had your
sentiments thereon.

Your Letter to the Lord Proprietary dated in October 1751.
his Lordship but very lately received; whereby I understand you
intend on your return to England to remain here, and if so, I must
appoint a new Deputy.

My Lord being arrived, he designs with the advice of his Guardians
soon to nominate & fix on a proper Person for his Lieutenant Governor
of Maryland. The Person entirely to fix on is not yet so determin'd
as to be certainly mentioned to you by this Conveyance.
