accordingly. I thank you for your Testimony of Service,
you may depend upon my Zeal for yours, not actuated
by pecuniary interest. As to my Salary, I hope it makes
no Person uneasy, as it is a Recompence for my real Ex-
pences, Trouble & Endeavours in Office to the Lord Proprietary,
the Persons in the Administration of Government, and the
welfare of the Province in general, as to all Affairs from
England;
