 The necessity whereof you will perceive by the inclosed  
 Copy of the Report from the Board of Trade upon the Pe-  
 tition of the Guardians of the Lord Baltimore a Minor,  
 requesting that the consideration of ~~the Guardian~~  
 of a Petition of Mr Penn Proprietor of Pennsylvania  
 about the Boundaries may be put off 'till Lord Baltimore  
 shall be of age.

Lord Baltimore with his Guardian & Mr William  
 Penn were present at the Board of Trade; and on Mr  
 Penn's desiring to with draw his Petition rather  
 than appear as an Adversary to Lord Baltimore, the two  
 Proprietors express'd their reciprocal Desire of living  
 in Friendship & good Neighbourhood; which was mutually  
 accepted by each other, for a future amicable Agreement;  
 which certainly cannot be perfected unless the previous  
 Preliminary first takes place; that is, the abolishing  
 the articles of Agreement with the late Lord, as they are  
 not binding on the present Lord; and I have some reason  
 to think Mr Penn is of the same opinion, but of that you  
 will hereafter hear further.

 refused you his assistance, tho' at the same time he had  
 a Letter on the same Subject of Boundaries from me; however  
 My Lord Proprietary thinks it was his Duty to have assisted  
 you in the best manner he could therein: His Lordship from
