I am credibly inform'd his Lordship own'd the Discourse as is so set down by Mr Brook in his Letter to the Representatives, and I think I may conclude he will not make a second visit to his Lordship. As to that part of his charge level'd against the Jesuits, Chappels & Chaplains, also Schools; and set forth by the Committee of Grievances of the Lower House & Court of Justice June 17<sup>th</sup> last is by the Guardians regarded to be of dangerous consequence and calls for the Laws to be put in Execution against them, in case such charge is true; as the neglecting so to do, may be deem'd a Fault in the Administration of Government within the Province, the Magistrates being provided with sufficient Laws, to entirely check any dangerous Consequences resulting from such superstitious Principles.
