

of August last, we have taken into our consideration ^{the} ~~the~~
 humble Petition of the Right Hon^{ble} Arthur Onslow Esq^r: Speaker
 of the House of Commons and one of His Majesty's most honourable
 Council and of John Sharpe of Lincoln's Inn Esq^r: the Guardian
 of the Person and Estate of the Right Honourable Frederick
 Lord Proprietary Baltimore, Lord Proprietary of the Province
 of Maryland an Infant under the age of Twenty one Years,
 praying for the Reasons therein contain'd that their Excellencies
 the Lords Justices will be pleased to postpone taking into considera-
 tion the Petition of the Proprietors of Pennsylvania for appointing
 Persons to set out the Boundaries of that Province and that all
 further Proceedings thereon may be stay'd staid until such time
 as the said Frederick Lord Baltimore the Proprietor of Maryland
 shall have compleated his age of Twenty one Years which will
 be in February next, and that His Lordship may be then heard
 in what he may then have to offer, or that their Excellencies
 will be pleased to give such further and other orders and Directions
 in the Premises as the nature and Circumstances of the Case shall
 require and as to their Excellencies in their great wisdom and
 Justice shall seem meet" and having been attended by the Guardian
 of the said Lord Baltimore, with Mr. Henley and Mr. Pratt their
 Counsel, and also by William Penn Esq^r: one of the Proprietors of the
 Province of Pennsylvania, with the Honourable Mr. Hume Campbell
 and Mr. Forrester his Counsel, and having heard what they had to
 offer in support of their respective Petitions. It was declared on the
 part and in the behalf of Mr. Penn that as he had no intention
 to carry on this affair in an adverse manner, he was ready and
 willing out of civility to Lord Baltimore and respect to his Guardian
 to consent, that the Consideration of his Petition should be
 postponed until Lord Baltimore should attain the age of Twenty
 one Years which proposal being accepted by his Lordship's Guardian
 we have with the mutual consent and agreement of both the Parties
 postponed the Consideration of Mr. Penn's Petition referred to us by your
 Lordships Order dated the 2^d of July last, until the first Thursday in April
 next which we hope will meet with your Lordship's approbation
 and
