Act was repealed by an Act of Assembly the 20<sup>th</sup> of May 1717  
and also one other Act made the 6<sup>th</sup> of March 1707 suspending  
the Exemption of some clauses of the afore mentioned act, until  
her Majestys further Pleasure should be declared & signified  
therein, concerning which suspension Act sundry great Dis-  
putes ause among the Romanists: For Removal of such Disputes.  
An Act of Parliament made the eleventh & twelfth of William  
the 3<sup>d</sup>. was incorporated into the said act of 1717. which  
recites there is good provision in the said Act of William the  
3<sup>d</sup> to prevent the Growth of Popery as well in this Province as  
throughout all others of his Majestys Dominions; and that  
an Act of Assembly of this Province can in no ways alter  
the Effect of that Statute, therefore the said Act of Assembly  
in 1704. to prevent the growth of Popery was thereby repealed.

The said Statute of William the 3<sup>d</sup>. intituled an Act  
for the further preventing the Growth of Popery. .... Enacts  
inter alias. vizt.

Section 1<sup>st</sup> " £ 100. Reward for taking Popish Bishops,  
" Priests or Jesuits."

2<sup>d</sup> " Penalty on a Popish Bishop, Priest &c saying Mass  
" or Exercising any office of a Popish Bishop or  
" Priest within these Realms or the Dominions  
" therunto belonging.— or if any Priest or Person  
" professing the Popish Religion shall keep any  
" School or take the Education or Government  
" or Boarding of Persons.... Such Person or Persons  
" being being lawfully convicted shall on such con-  
" viction be adjudged to perpetual Imprisonment &c

3<sup>rd</sup> " Person sending a Child...— beyond Sea to be educated  
" in the Romish Religion to forfeit £ 100.—
