Sir.

Yours of the 10th of August & 29th of September
 last are come to hand, I have exerted my self & done all
 that is in my Power concerning Mr. Stirling's appointment as
 Collector at Chester, whereby he has deprived you of a large
 part of your District as Collector at Annapolis; and I think
 I may say for certain I have succeed so far, as to obtain
 a Confinement of his Power to Chester River only; and your
 not having appointed a Deputy there, has occasion'd an officer
 to be nominated, as thought absolutely necessary by the Govern-
 ment here.

As to Mr. Stirling's obtaining that nomination, I take
 upon me to say that I believe Mr. Hanbury had no hand in
 procuring it, from his own Declaration & other Reasons:
 Mr. Hanbury has evinc'd his Sincerity therein by his acting
 in
