take care in the Passing of any Act of an Unusual and Extraordinary nature, that there be a clause inserted therein, suspending and Deferring the Execution thereof, until my Pleasure be known concerning the said Act, to the end my Charter Privileges may not suffer, and that His Majesty's subjects may not have reasons to complain of Hardships put upon them on the like occasions.

You are to observe in the Passing of all Laws, that whatever may be requisite upon each different matter be accordingly Provided for by a different Law, without intermixing with one and the same Act such things as have no proper Relation to each other. — And You are more especially to take care, that no clause or clauses be inserted in, or annexed to any Act which shall be foreign to what the Title of such Act imports; And that no perpetual clause be part of any Temporary Law, and that no Act whatever be suspended, altered, Revived, confirmed or Repealed by General words; But that the Title and Date of such Act so suspended, altered, Revived, confirmed or repealed be particularly mentioned and expressed.

You are to suffer no Law relating to our Paper Currency to pass without a Suspension clause that it shall not take Effect until it has been sent over for my Perusal, and my Approbation thereof returned to the Province it being absolutely necessary for the Trade of His Majesty's subjects here to consult with them on that Head.

You are from time to time to fill up all vacant places in our said Province of Maryland, and appoint and
