

- 41.) You shall not erect any Court or Office of Judicature not before Erected or Established, nor Dissolve any Court or Office already erected or established; without my special order.
- 42.) You are to transmit unto me or to our Secretary residing in England to be laid before me with all convenient speed, a particular account of all Establishments of Jurisdiction, Courts, Officers, Powers, Authorities, Fees and Priviledges granted or settled within our said Province.
- 43.) And you are to take care, that no Courts of Judicature be adjourned, but upon good Grounds, and to prevent the Abuse that may be committed in the Benning and Entering of Orders of the said Court; you are to be particularly carefull, that no orders of any Court of Judicature be entered or allowed which shall not be first read and approved by the Magistrates in open Court; which Rule you are in like manner to see observed, with Relation to the Proceedings in our Council of State in Maryland; and that all orders there made be first Read and Approved in Council before they are entered upon the Council Books.
- 44.) And you are with the Advice and Consent of our said Council, to take special Care to Regulate all Salaries and Fees, belonging to Places or paid upon Emergencies, That they be within the Bounds of Moderation, and that no Exaction be made
