Q7.) Whereas the numbers of manors and  
the Quantity of Lands contain'd in each of them is  
Inconsiderable, both in respect as to Reserved Soil,  
and numbers of manors Erected to view of France  
pledge; And whereas it is from these Properties in  
our said Province the Proprietary's Revenues are  
chiefly to increase from time to time; all other Reve-  
nues Issuing from Lands within our said Province being  
granted out to the Purchasers in absolute Fee simple  
and subject only to a small annual Quit Rent to the  
Proprietary's and their Heirs. — And whereas  
it is certain, that if my Predecessors had carefully  
followed the Plan of the first Lord Proprietary of our  
said Province, in reserving Judiciously particular  
Parcels of Lands in and about our said Province,  
such Properties would have been by this time, a most  
valuable augmentation of Riches and Strength to me  
and our said Province; As the Increase of People settling  
about such premises would have made <sup>the</sup> Demand of those  
Lands very valuable, and been one of the chiefest Re-  
compence to the Lord Proprietarys of our said Province  
for their first charges, great Expences, and Labours for  
the Enlargement of the Empire of Great Britain.
