And whenever you shall judge it necessary, you are to advise not only with our said officers, but also to advise with and consult our Council of state herein.

As to my Private Property which is so much under your care both as Lieutenant Governor and Chancellor, I desire nothing but equal Justice with my Tenants in all respects; and that you will always have it in your view to do Justice to them, you will have the same regard to my just Rights and Properties, and be particularly carefull that in all Acts relating to the Landoffice there be nothing inserted in them to my Prejudice; and I hope you will always take care to consult with our Judge of the Landoffice, Agent and Receiver General and other Officers in our said Province, that are intrusted with you and are Officers under your Direction, in every thing relating to my Interest, and that you will always show a due regard to their just Representations.

Whereas by one of the foregoing Instructions you are ordered with the advice of our Judge of our Landoffice, and Agent and Receiver General, to direct that Warrants be issued out for Lands on the Borders and Frontiers of our said Province, in such manner and on such conditions as the Messieurs Penns Proprietors of Pennsylvania have settled and fixed on the Borders and Frontiers of their Province. And whereas I have been inform'd that the Germans who settle in Pennsylvania, do pay Fifteen Bounds of Pennsylvania currency per hundred acres caution money which is about nine Bounds Sterling money, and Four Shillings Sterling per hundred acres for Quit Rents to the Proprietors of Pennsylvania, which valuation of
