London Justices of Ann Arundel County Court begun and  
held at the City of Annapolis in and for the County afore-  
said on the second Tuesday of March being the 14<sup>th</sup>  
Day of the same Month Anno Domini 1786. Nevertheless  
we grant unto him the said Negro Harry our Firm Peace  
and will not that he suffer any Corporal or other Punishment  
therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same Pledge  
and Condition to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever as if  
the Crime whereof he the said Negro Harry hath been  
convicted had never been done or committed Provided  
the said Allen Quym shall transport or cause to be  
transported out of this State the said Negro Harry within  
two Months from the date of these Presents or as soon  
thereafter as he may be recovered from his ill state of  
Health

Maryland this twenty fifth Day of April in the  
Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and  
eighty six.
