the hours of eight and ten in the night of the same Day with force
and arms at the County aforesaid the Store house of a certain
John Elser Gist then there situate feloniously and Burglariously
did break and enter and one piece of printed Linnen of the value
of three pounds Current Money of Maryland, seven bordered lawn
Handkerchiefs of the value of two Shillings Current Money each,
two red bordered Gauze Handkerchiefs of the value of one Shilling
like money, and fifteen yards of Ribband of the value of one shil-
ling Current Money each yard of the Goods and Chattels of the
said John Elser Gist then there in the said Store house being found
then and there feloniously and Burglariously did steal take
and carry away contrary to the Act of Assembly in that case
made and provided and against the Peace Government and Dignity
of the State of Maryland, whereof he the said James Smith
alias Faulk hath been convicted before the Worshipful Andrew
Buchanan and others his Associates, Justices of Baltimore
County Court hold at the Court house in Baltimore Town
in and for the County aforesaid the Tuesday before the Monday
preceeding the first Tuesday in February in the year of our Lord
One thousand seven hundred and eighty six Nevertheless we
grant unto him the said James Smith alias Faulk our
firm Peace and will not that he suffer any Corporal ^{or other} Punish-
ment therefor, but that he shall stand and be in the same
Plight and Condition to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever
as if the same whereof he the said James Smith al.
