Given under the Seal of the State of Maryland this Twenty sixth Day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty six

To all our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting

Know Ye that of our especial Grace we have Pardoned unto Negro Guy Slave of Job Garretson of Baltimore County as a proper Object of our Mercy the Suit of our Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he not having the fear of God before his Eyes but being moved and seduced by the instigation of the Devil on the fourth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty two with force and arms at the County aforesaid in and upon One Negro Nathan Slave of Job Garretson the said Nathan then and there being in the Peace of God and of the State feloniously, wilfully and of his malice aforethought did make an Assault, and that the said Guy with a certain sum of pence of the value of six pence which he the said Guy
